COVID-19 Protocol

The Wine & Food Foundation is thrilled to host our burgeoning wine community and Kerloo Cellars for our Flavors of Fall Event on Thursday, October 21 at Hotel Ella. The safety of our community is our top priority. We have been adapting our plans based on new and evolving information through the recommendations of Travis County, the state of Texas and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). The Wine & Food Foundation has put important measures in place to ensure the health and safety of our attendees during this event.

All who attend and participate in this event must provide the following:

- proof of a negative COVID-19 test result* and/or
- proof of full vaccination**

Before you arrive

- If you feel sick, please stay home. Please refer to the CDC's COVID-19 Self-Checker reference guide to assess any symptoms you may be experiencing.
- Check your flight and travel arrangements. Each airline and transportation provider has outlined their own restrictions for the health and safety of travelers.
- Please have your documentation ready upon arrival the more prepared you are, the faster entry will be. Upon check-in at registration, you will be asked to show your negative COVID-19 test result and/or proof of full vaccination before entering the event. All negative tests and/or vaccination cards should be dated.
- Before the event, the Wine & Food Foundation will conduct inspections with Hotel Ella to ensure the venue is safe, clean and ready for the event.

- We ask that you fully comply with applicable CDC COVID-19 health and safety measures and protocols for attendance at the event.
- Have you completed a daily self-assessment, and are you symptom-free? If you feel sick, please stay home. You can refer to the CDC's COVID-19 Self-Checker reference guide for any questions on symptoms by clicking here.
- Social distancing requirements will be in compliance with the <u>Hotel Ella Health & Safety</u> <u>Guidelines.</u>

Inside the event

- Masks are recommended to be worn by all individuals, regardless of COVID-19 vaccination status, unless seated, eating and/or drinking.
- Please follow all recommended health and safety measures, including washing your hands often, covering your cough or sneeze and staying home if you are sick.
- Daily disinfecting will take place to sanitize all seating, restrooms and frequently touched public areas.
- Sanitation stations will be located throughout the event in public spaces, foyers and meeting spaces.

- *Attendees must show their negative test results upon arrival at the Flavors of Fall Event. The accepted COVID-19 tests are: FDA-Approved at-home test, PCR (also called diagnostic or molecular) or rapid antigen test (frequently referred to as "rapid test"). The tests must be conducted within 48 hours prior to arrival to the Flavors of Fall Event.
- ** If you do not wish to show a negative COVID-19 test, then you may choose to voluntarily present proof of your full vaccination against COVID-19 instead of a copy of your negative COVID-19 test. (A person will be considered fully vaccinated two weeks after the final dose of the applicable vaccine regimen). An original, copy, digital version or photo of your vaccination card will be accepted as proof of vaccination if presented to security prior to entry to the Flavors of Fall Event. Please note that your provision of proof of vaccination is optional and is not a requirement for your entry to any of the events listed above. Only vaccines authorized and recommended by the Centers for Disease and Prevention for use in the United States can

be used as proof of vaccination. The date of the second dose of a two-dose vaccination (Moderna or Pfizer-BioNTech/Comirnaty) should be on or before October 7, 2021. The date of single-dose vaccination (Johnson & Johnson) should be on or before October 7, 2021. Although it isn't recommended, the CDC recognizes there are unique circumstances in which individuals have received different vaccines. Those individuals are considered fully vaccinated.

<u>Patrons unable to meet these requirements may receive a refund if requested by 5:00pm on Friday, October 15, 2021.</u> The Wine & Food Foundation will notify ticket holders of any changes as the situation progresses, including in "Know Before You Go" emails.
