

2022 Big Reds & Bubbles COVID-19 Protocols

The Wine & Food Foundation is thrilled to bring back Big Reds and Bubbles to the Austin community on Thursday, February 10, 2022 at Fair Market. The safety of our community is our top priority. We have been adapting our plans based on new and evolving information in regards to COVID-19 through the recommendations of Travis County and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Based on these recommendations, and feedback from our supporters and sponsors, the Foundation has put important measures in place to ensure the health and safety of our attendees during this event.

All who attend and participate at the 2022 Big Reds & Bubbles event must provide the following:

- proof of a negative COVID-19 test result* and/or
- proof of full vaccination**

Before you arrive

- If you feel sick, please stay home. Please refer to the CDC's COVID-19 Self-Checker reference guide to assess any symptoms you may be experiencing.
- Please have your documentation ready upon arrival the more prepared you are, the faster entry will be. Upon check-in at registration, you will be asked to show a negative COVID-19 test result and/or proof of full vaccination before entering the event. All negative tests and/or vaccination cards should be dated.
- Before the event, the Wine & Food Foundation will conduct inspections with Fair Market to ensure the venue is safe, clean and ready for the event.

Arriving at Big Reds & Bubbles:

- We ask that you fully comply with applicable <u>CDC COVID-19 health and safety</u> <u>measures</u> and protocols for attendance at the event.
- Have you completed a daily <u>self-assessment</u>, and are you symptom-free? If you feel sick, please stay home.

Inside the event:

- Masks are recommended to be worn by all individuals, regardless of COVID-19 vaccination status, unless seated, eating and/or drinking.
- Please follow all recommended health and safety measures, including washing your hands often, covering your cough or sneeze and staying home if you are sick.
- Daily disinfecting will take place to sanitize all seating, restrooms and frequently touched public areas.
- Sanitation stations will be located throughout the event in public spaces, foyers and meeting spaces.

^{*}Attendees must show their negative test results upon arrival to Big Reds & Bubbles. The accepted COVID-19 tests are: FDA-Approved at-home test, PCR (also called diagnostic or molecular) or rapid antigen test (frequently referred to as "rapid test"). The tests must be conducted within 48 hours prior to arrival to Big Reds & Bubbles.

** If you do not wish to show a negative COVID-19 test, then you may choose to voluntarily present proof of your full vaccination against COVID-19 instead of a copy of your negative COVID-19 test. (A person will be considered fully vaccinated two weeks after the final dose of the applicable vaccine regimen). An original, copy, digital version or photo of your vaccination card will be accepted as proof of vaccination if presented to security prior to entry to Big Reds & Bubbles. Please note that your provision of proof of vaccination is optional – and is not a requirement – for your entry to the event listed above. Only vaccines authorized and recommended by the Centers for Disease and Prevention for use in the United States can be used as proof of vaccination. The date of the second dose of a two-dose vaccination (Moderna or Pfizer-BioNTech/Comirnaty) should be on or before January 27, 2022. The date of single-dose vaccination (Johnson & Johnson) should be on or before January 27, 2022. Although it isn't recommended, the CDC recognizes there are unique circumstances in which individuals have received different vaccines. Those individuals are considered fully vaccinated.

Patrons unable to meet these requirements may receive a refund if requested by 5:00pm on Friday, January 28, 2022. The Wine & Food Foundation will notify ticket holders of any changes as the situation progresses, including in "Know Before You Go" emails.
